

The California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) has developed a program to enable the movement of bulk citrus fruit with stems and leaves out of the Asian citrus psyllid (ACP) restricted areas of Tulare County to approved receivers. The citrus fruit with stems and leaves must have originated in a grove that was treated with a CDFA approved insecticide, and must be harvested and shipped within seven days after the application and re-entry interval.

Instructions for Growers and Grove Managers wishing to participate in this option to move bulk citrus with stems and leaves out of the ACP restricted areas of Tulare County:

- 1. Obtain the following two documents:
  - a. Cooperative Asian Citrus Psyllid Project, Compliance Agreement-Restricted Area
  - b. Exhibit T-Grower/Grove Manager
- 2. Review and sign both documents.
- 3. Submit both signed documents to the CDFA ACP Project at:
